

## UPDATE BULLETIN: 22 Nov 2020

### Kalyra is still in CODE Orange – Preservation Plan

#### Residential Aged Care Facilities are working under Emergency Direction No. 14:

- Anyone entering a Kalyra site is required to make a declaration which includes:
  - flu vax,
  - temperature check,
  - no cold or flu symptoms in last 73 hours (no high temperature/fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or fatigue),
  - no contact with a person with covid or waiting on covid test,
  - not been in location identified by SA Health as risk area [link](#)
- There is one visit per resident per day of up to two people
  - We will assess exceptional circumstances for palliative care and dementia residents, potential end-of-life situations and other compassionate grounds on a case by case basis.
- Visitors are required to wear masks and if fail to do so a risk management report will be lodged within our system.
- Aged care residents are **strongly advised** to not to go out to shops or cafes as they may risk exposure and not be allowed to return
- Aged care residents are only to go out for urgent medical need and should wear a mask if they do so.
- Restricting staff access to those who perform critical functions.
- Staff will be wearing masks

#### For Residents in Retirement Villages

- Community Centers will open on Monday, 23 November 2020
- Residents will be free to go out and about but are **strongly advised to wear a mask when in public and observe good hand hygiene.**
- Staff will be wearing masks

#### For Clients of Help at Home Services

- Clients will be free to go out and about but are **strongly advised to wear a mask when in public and observe good hand hygiene.**
- Domestic visits will start again
- Staff will continue to wear masks
