Kalyra remains in CODE Orange – Preservation Plan for holiday period

Residential Aged Care Facilities are working under Emergency Direction No. 20

- Anyone entering a Kalyra site is required to make a declaration which includes:
 - flu vax,
 - temperature check,
 - no cold or flu symptoms in last 72 hours (no high temperature/fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or fatigue, loss of taste/smell),
 - no contact with a person with COVID or waiting on COVID test,
 - not been in location identified by SA Health as risk area [link](#).
- There is no limit of visits to residents per day
- Visitors are asked to wear masks and if they fail to do so a risk management report will be lodged within our system.
- Aged care residents are allowed to go out and about and **strongly advised** to:
 - Wear a mask in public
 - Avoid crowded venues
 - Avoid busy times
 - Opt for outdoor tables
 - Strictly observe hand hygiene and social distancing at all times.
- Restricting staff access to those who perform critical functions.
- Staff will be continuing to wear masks in residential care at Kalyra. Visitors are also asked to do so.

For Residents in Retirement Villages

- Residents are free to go out and about but are **strongly advised to wear a mask when in public, observe good hand hygiene, social distance and avoid busy/Crowded public places.**

For Clients of Help at Home Services

- Clients will be free to go out and about but are **strongly advised to wear a mask when in public, observe good hand hygiene, social distance and avoid busy/Crowded public places.**
- Staff will continue to wear masks.
